



Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure 2016-2017

Pupil Premium is a government funding initiative to provide support to specific groups of children who are vulnerable to ensure they reach their full potential both academically and socially. The fund allocated to a school is based on the percentage of pupils who are receiving free school meals, have received free school meals in one of the previous 6 years (Ever 6) or are a child looked after (CLA), or a child from service personnel.

At Roundwood Primary School, the number of pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium funding is small, however, in 2016-2017 we received: **£3800**
