

# Reception Summer 2024

## Communication and Language

We will be learning to broaden our vocabulary by using our imagination to recreate roles and experiences that are linked to our topic and wider learning.

## Understanding the World

We shall continue to support the children to enhance their learning through the interaction with a range of technology.

We will be comparing a country in South America and the United Kingdom and will find out how they are similar and how they differ to each other.

We shall be learning about the history of Dinosaurs and the work of Mary Anning.

We shall be talking about and observing changes within different lifecycles e.g. ducklings and runner beans.

## Expressive Art and Design

We will be continuing to explore a variety of different media.

We will be listening and responding to different types of music and playing instruments alongside.

We shall be listening to music from different cultures and explaining how it makes us feel.

## Literacy

We will be using our knowledge of phonics to support reading and writing simple sentences. A selection of stories will be read focusing on how they are structured into a beginning, middle and end. We shall draw story maps to help sequence stories and use interesting words to describe the characters and different settings.

## Personal, Social and Emotional

We shall be learning to listen to each other and to respond in different ways.

We shall continue to use the Colour Monster to help explain how we are feeling and why we feel that way.



## Mathematics

We shall be naming and describing 3D shapes, recalling number bonds to 10 and identifying, copying and creating our own patterns.

We will build numbers from 10-20 using a variety of different resources to show their representation.

## Physical Development

Children will continue to explore space and how to use space safely.

Our PE sessions will focus on aiming and controlling a small ball with a racquet.

We shall also be learning to work together to play as a team, supporting and encouraging our peers.

Our Busy Finger activities will continue to support the development of fine motor skills for handwriting and cutting activities.
